Help kids develop reading comprehension and problem solving skills while reading and writing sight words.

This packet is designed to help students develop reading comprehension and problem solving skills as they work with sight words.

This pack addresses the following First Grade Common Core ELA Standard: CCSS.ELA.Literacy.RF.1.3G: Recognize and read grade-appropriate irregularly spelled words.

This pack includes 24 sight word riddle cards that can be used for individual work, partner work and/or Scoot games. Directions, a recording sheet, and an answer sheet follow.

For partner work, I have kids take turns choosing a card and discussing the answer with their partner. If the two partners do not agree right away, they explain their thinking to one another. Once they have come to an agreement, they write their answer on the recording form. When they have completed the set, they use the answer sheet to check their work. Students can also complete these problems individually and then check their work against the answer sheet.

Sight Word Riddle Scoot

- 1) To prepare, print the cards and cut them apart. Optional: Print on cardstock for durability.
- 2) Make a copy of the Scoot recording sheet and the sight word sheet for each student. I always make a few extras, just in case . . .
- 3) Set the sight word riddle cards at convenient locations throughout the room. Desks work well. Sight word riddle cards can also be set at tables or counters around the room. Decide how you would like students to rotate around the room. Place the cards in order according to the way you will have students rotate.
- 4) Explain to kids how they will be rotating around the room to answer all the sight word riddles.
- 5) Read through the list of sight words together. Explain that students will be using these words to answer their sight word riddles.
- 6) Give each student a Scoot recording sheet. If students are at desks, their own desk is their starting point. If not, have each child go to a spot with a sight word riddle card. Students will record their answers by looking at the number on the riddle card and matching it to the number on their Scoot recording sheet.
- 7) Have each child answer his/her first sight word riddle.
- After a set amount of time, or when you see students are ready, say "Scoot." Students move to the next spot in the rotation.
- 9) Continue until students have completed all cards (or until you choose to stop).
- 10) Each game has 24 cards. If you have more than 24 students, just assign a few free spots in the rotation. Kids can take a quick break or even get a quick drink when they get to a "free spot."
